Dear Representative Nadler:

On behalf of the American Public Transportation Association (APTA) and its nearly 1,500 member organizations, I write to thank you for the introduction of H.R. 2497, the Transportation Job Corps Act of 2009. We have long sought to address employment issues faced by the transit industry and are confident H.R. 2497 provides a blueprint to begin achieving these goals. APTA supports this legislation and commends you and your staff for making transit workforce development issues a priority.

Fueled by a rapidly aging workforce, the transit industry is poised to face a significant worker shortage in the coming years. Furthermore, industry growth coupled with advances in technology has created an urgent need for a comprehensive overhaul of transit employee training and development programs. The Transportation Job Corps Act of 2009 seeks to address these issues by creating national and regional councils tasked with identifying and putting forth solutions to issues related to transit agency skills gaps, management development and employee retention. H.R. 2497 also establishes four new grant programs, providing funding for basic skills, apprenticeship, education and retention and diversity programs.

The Transportation Job Corps Act of 2009 provides the development programs needed to ensure that our nation's public transportation workforce adapts to emerging technologies in a rapidly growing industry. Your innovative legislative proposal demonstrates an unprecedented level of commitment and ensures that our industry has the tools to properly train its workforce.
