

The Northeast Regional Rail Network

A Network of Corridors Serving 12 State Region and Beyond

- Northeast Corridor (NEC) Spine: Boston Washington, D.C
 - Nation's Most Complex, Heavily Used Passenger Rail Corridor
 - Four Public Owners: Amtrak, NY/MTA, CTDOT, MA/MBTA
 - Intense, Mixed Use Traffic: Amtrak, 8 Commuter Railroads, 7 Freight Railroads

■ Connectors to the NEC Spine

- Northeastern New England Corridors: Downeaster, Boston-Montreal, Knowledge Corridor,
- Vermont Western Corridor Burlington to NYC
- Empire Corridor: NYC-Albany-Niagara Falls, NYC-Albany-Montreal
- Keystone Corridor Harrisburg-Philadelphia
- NEC Extension Virginia
- Public and Private Ownership: Amtrak, States, Class I, Regional and Short Lines
- Mixed Use Traffic
- Serves Over 50 Million People
- Links Major Metropolitan Areas and Rural/Small Urban Communities
- **Connects Northeast Canada & States South and West**



Established System – Expanding Demand for Service

Today:

- 2,500 Trains Daily: High Speed, Regional, Long-distance Intercity Service, Commuter, Freight
- **High Speed Service: NEC, Empire (South), Keystone Corridors**
- 258 Million Riders Annually
- 13 Million Intercity Passengers
 - NEC Spine: 10.8 Million
 - NEC Connectors: 3.5 Million
- Many NEC Spine Segments Near or At Capacity
- Reliability Challenged by Infrastructure Condition and Growth in Ridership

Projected – 2030:

- 3,600 Daily Trains
- 412 Million Riders



Network of Corridors: An Asset for Regional Connectivity

- Rail is About More Than Faster, Better Trains It's About Performance Toward Goals
- Critical to:
 - Mobility and Access for Citizens and Businesses
 - **Economic Development, Job Retention and Creation**
 - Community Revitalization in Metro Areas and Smaller Communities
 - **Smart Energy Use and Environmental Stewardship**

- Quality Service: Safe, Reliable, Frequent, Higher Speed, Time-Price Competitive
 - **Higher Speed Regional And Premium Service**
 - **Expanded Service in Existing and New Markets**
 - Reduced Travel Times. More Frequent Service. Reliable Performance
- Greater Reliability and Capacity
 - State of Good Repair
 - Intercity, Commuter, Freight Service Growth
- **■** Greater System Efficiency
 - **Enhanced Intermodal Connectivity**
 - **Comprehensive Coordinated Planning of Infrastructure-Operational Improvements**



Intercity Rail Projects in Process

- Corridor-wide: NEC Infrastructure Master Plan
- Maine: Upgrade existing Boston-Portland; extend service to Brunswick
- Vermont: Upgrade service to Albany and to Massachusetts and Connecticut
- Massachusetts: Upgrade and restore service Knowledge Corridor
- **Rhode Island: Airport connector station**
- Connecticut: Expand capacity on Connecticut-Massachusetts corridor; upgrade reliability bridges
- New York: Develop New York City Moynihan Station; HSR Service on Empire Corridor
- New Jersey: Upgrade reliability and capacity Portal Bridge
- Delaware: Upgrade reliability and capacity third track
- Pennsylvania: Upgrade service Keystone Corridor
- Maryland: Upgrade reliability and capacity tunnels, major bridges, airport station
- District of Columbia: Upgrade reliability and connectivity station and bridge


