Phillip Staub is Associate General Counsel at the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit Authority (WMATA). When he joined WMATA in 1994 his focus was procurement matters and litigating pre- and post-contract disputes. Later, Mr. Staub broadened his practice at WMATA to employment, legislative and regulatory matters. His contributions toward WMATA policy and governance include whistleblower, incident investigation, drug and alcohol testing, procurement, use of electronic devices and joint development policies. Mr. Staub has trained WMATA employees regarding EEO, freedom of information and privacy law. Recent accomplishments include preparing state and federal legislation to amend WMATA's Compact and to secure capital funding commitments, leading a multi-disciplinary team to develop and implement new electronic document management and retention systems and working with the WMATA Board of Directors to establish bylaws and update its procedures and code of ethics. In 2012, Mr. Staub prepared WMATA's brief in *AFDI v. WMATA*, a case involving the balance between transit security and the First Amendment, and argued the case before the U.S. District Court in DC.
