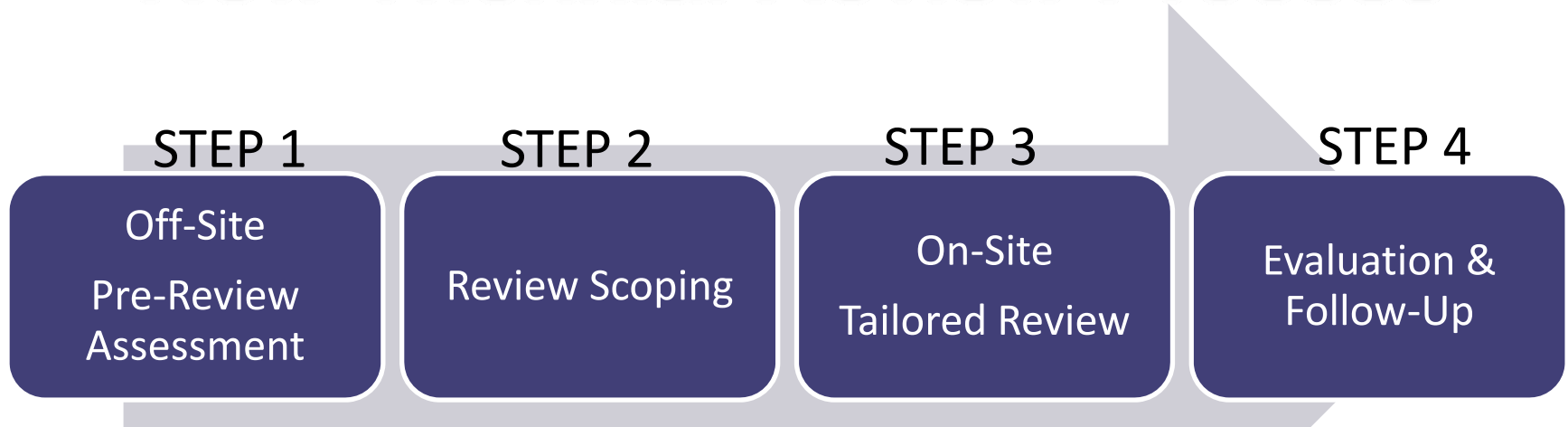
# FTA Revamps Triennial Review Program

- New FY 2013 process:
  - ✓ A more proactive, risk-based approach
  - ✓ Clarification and streamlining of review questions
  - ✓ Enhanced review modules, when needed, to address high-risk oversight areas of:
    - Technical Capacity
    - Financial Capacity
    - Financial Management
    - Procurement
    - DBE
    - ADA
    - Title VI
    - Maintenance

# Revised Triennial Review Benefits Grantees

- Forward Looking instead of Reactive
- Structured assessment of risk prior to going on-site
- Asking the “right” questions
- Modules improve our ability to rapidly address areas of concern to help grantees get out ahead of problems
- More effectively address findings in high risk areas and reduce repeat findings in these areas
- Decrease the need for multiple reviews of a grantee within a fiscal year
- Program-level and grantee-specific technical assistance

# New Triennial Review Process



1. Off-site assessment of high-risk areas and background information
2. FTA decision on whether to add “modules” offering enhanced level of review in any of seven (7) high-risk areas
3. Streamlined baseline on-site review, plus any modules selected
4. Evaluation and follow-up actions, including targeted technical assistance
