

99 Percent of Funds Obligated and 81 Percent Outlaid



# APTA Policy Recommendations Enacted Into Law

- ✓ Increase Small Transit Intensive Cities (STIC) set-aside from two percent to three percent (IIJA)
- ✓ Increase maximum federal and total estimated net capital costs for Small Start projects (IIJA)
- Extend the time period for Core Capacity projects to be at or over capacity from five years to 10 years (IIJA)
- Strike the requirement for New Start and Core Capacity project sponsors to complete a Before and After Study and require the Government Accountability Office to provide Congress a biannual report that analyzes the impacts of New Starts and Core Capacity projects on public transportation services and ridership (IIJA)
- ✓ Expand the use of warrants for CIG (IIJA)
- ✓ Establish a CIG Program Pipeline Dashboard (IIJA)
- Reduce the required period of notification to Congress before issuing a letter of intent, entering into an FFGA, or entering into an early systems work agreement (IIJA)
- ✓ Add eligibility for commuter rail projects in Railroad Crossing Elimination Program (IIJA)
  - Increase funding for the Transit Cooperative Research Program (TCRP) (IIJA)
  - Fund FTA administrative salaries from the Mass Transit Account rather than the General Fund to allow FTA employees to continue many of their functions in the event of a government shutdown (IIJA)





# APTA Policy Recommendations Enacted Into Law

- Enact a long-term surface transportation authorization act to bring transit systems to a state of good repair and meet growing community demands for increased mobility choices (IIJA)
- Reestablish a 40-40-20 capital investment ratio among the Capital Investment Grants, State
  of Good Repair, and Buses and Bus Facilities programs (IIJA)
- Seek alternative, long-term solutions to the Highway Trust Fund that maintain a user-fee nexus, including establishing a national pilot program for VMT fees (IIJA)
- ✓ Repeal FAST Act Contract Authority Rescission
- Repeal the provision in the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act that creates new tax liabilities for taxexempt entities that offer transportation benefits
- Reauthorize the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise program for federally assisted public transportation and passenger rail projects
- Raise cap on Private Activity Bonds (PABs) above \$15 billion (IIJA)
- ✓ Grant expedited TIFIA credit reviews to low-risk candidates (IIJA)
- ✓ Authorize federal funds for credit risk premiums to leverage RRIF loan assistance (IIJA)
  - Permanently extend eligibility for TOD projects for RRIF loans and loan guarantees (IIJA)
- Require DOT to repay the credit risk premium for recipients that have satisfied all obligations that attached to RRIF loans (IIJA)


#### **U.S. Public Transit Ridership**






#### **Transit Agencies Experiencing Fiscal Cliff**






#### P.L. 118-5, the Fiscal Responsibility Act

- ✓ Suspends the Debt Limit until January 2025 and Establishes Budget Caps for FY 2024 and FY 2025
- ✓ Rescinds Unobligated COVID-19 Relief
  But Does Not Rescind Public Transit Emergency Funds
- ✓ Streamlines NEPA Environmental Review
  - Narrows Environmental Review Determinations
  - Establishes Time and Page Limits for Environmental Analyses




