

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- The official policy document addressing the development of bicycle and pedestrian facilities for transportation purposes in the region
- The document includes:
 - Public Outreach Process
 - Goals & Policies
 - Bicycle & Pedestrian Network Information/Recommendations
 - Safety, Education, Encouragement, & Enforcement Programs
 - Funding and Implementation Recommendations

ADA Transition Plan





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- Identifies ADA deficiencies on sidewalks, curb ramps, crosswalks, and other pedestrian facilities
- Required by the Department of Justice when a city, county, or state has jurisdiction over streets and sidewalks
- Detailed data collection of over 175 miles of sidewalk

• Outreach included:

 Reno Access Advisory Committee (RAAC), Sparks Advisory Committee for the Disabled, PTAC, Washoe County Senior Services, Sparks Senior Center, Center for Independent Living, and Vocational Rehabilitation Center


