

Pilot Overview

- Objective: Test replacement of low-performing (5-8 boardings per hour) fixed-route service with subsidized rideshare
 - Three providers: Lyft, Uber and DeSoto Cab
- Initiated in January 2017 in conjunction with new route structure resulting from comprehensive operations analysis



Initial Results

Comparative Data for May 2017

Total Trips

• Go Dublin: 1,587

• Local Bus: 2,877

• Rapid Bus: 45,747

Average Subsidy per Trip

• Go Dublin: \$3.30

• Bus (Local and Rapid): \$7.66

Challenges and Concerns





- Obtaining data from rideshare operators
- ADA access separate contract to provide "on-call" wheelchair accessible vehicle
- Promo code doesn't always work
- Higher cost for passengers (~\$3 or more per trip)
