Barry introduced and invited the APTA Standards staff advisors to provide an update on the Sustainability and Urban Design Standards program.

Sustainability Working Group:

- Recently published <u>documents</u>:
 - *Recommended Practice for Social and Economic Sustainability for Transit Agencies (April* 2018)
 - *Recommended Practice for Quantifying Greenhouse Gas Emissions from Transit, Revision* 1 (September 2018)
- Documents in development:
 - Update to Guidelines for Climate Action Planning (2011)
 - Andrew Brennan, Rob Borowski, and Ali Adelman serve as co-chairs for this subworking group, which is focused on updating this outdated document and incorporating resiliency.

Urban Design Working Group:

- *Recently published documents:*
 - Recommended Practice "Bicycle Accessibility to Transit Facilities" focuses on bike parking and onboarding policies for buses and rail. (Will be published on APTA website in early October 2018)
- Documents in development:
 - Universal Design Guidelines document, which will have examples and best practices of how to accommodate all users at a bus stop or rail station.
 - The Arts in Transit group has also reconvened and had a robust working group meeting at our office in June. They updated the best practices in integrating art in transit document and developed a new proposal for transit art posters.

Barry introduced and invited Rich to provide an update on the 2019 Workshop. The two locations APTA is looking into is Pittsburg and Boston in the same time frame (late July/early August). APTA should select a location by the end of October.

6. Environmental Management Working Group

Kerin Lester from MARTA sought interest from Committee members on the possibility of forming an environmental management working group dedicated to the exchange of information. She explained that she developed the system based on the ISO 14001:2015 standard at MARTA, and it was difficult without guidance from other agencies. Amy Shatzkin agreed this was a great proposal and suggested that Sound Transit participate. Janet suggested that we send a survey out to Committee members to seek interest. Kerin confirmed interest from 8-10 agencies so far. Andrew mentioned that the could be really beneficial to smaller agencies who don't have a lot of resources.

7. Committee Bylaws Change – Vote for Approval

Following the 2016 APTA Annual Meeting, APTA Chair Doran Barnes and the Executive Committee reviewed the overarching issues APTA needs to address to ensure we are a relevant, well-structured and well-governed association. One area of focus is the APTA committee structure, how well it aligns with the association's mission and what work remains to be done to ensure the structure is well-managed.

Because of this directive, there is a proposed change to the bylaws that we have a Secretary. At the APTA Bus and Paratransit Conference, we proposed having a combined Vice Chair and Secretary to fulfill this requirement. However, we received some feedback and the Committee decided to create a new officer position with a Secretary to align better with other APTA committees. The proposed change would include:

- The Committee shall have the following officers: Chair, Vice Chair and Secretary. The Chair, Vice Chair, and Secretary shall be members of the Sustainability Committee.
- The Secretary shall be responsible for keeping adequate minutes of all committee meetings and work with APTA staff on the committee's collaboration web page. The Secretary shall preside at meetings in the absence of the Chair and Vice Chair.
- There is no provision for the succession to Vice Chair from the position of Secretary.
- The Chair shall appoint the Secretary in September 2018. After 2018, The Secretary shall be nominated by Committee Leadership of the Chair, Vice Chair, and Immediate Past Chair and elected by the Committee to occur at the APTA Annual Meeting in the appropriate year.
- The Secretary will serve a two-year term.

Barry conducted a vote that confirmed the change in bylaws.

Barry announced that Rob Borowski was appointed as Secretary.

Janet recognized Barry to his commitment to the Committee and the industry and presented a gift. She then asked Amy and Rob to introduce themselves and then briefly mentioned that the officers plan to solicit input for a Committee Work Plan for the next two years.
