


Texas Constitution

- Bill of Rights, Article 1, Section 23
- "Every citizen shall have the right to keep and bear arms in the lawful defense of himself or the State; but the Legislature shall have power, by law, to regulate the wearing of arms, with a view to prevent crime."

Do you need a license?

- Handgun yes
 - Concealed Carry
 - Open Carry
- Other types of guns - No



Concealed Handgun License (CHL)

- Gun cannot be visible, and its presence cannot be discernible through ordinary observation
- Law changed effective 1/1/2016



License to Carry (LTC)

- Allows conceal and/or open carry
- Open carry must use shoulder or belt holster
- Eligibility for license
 - Legal resident for 6 month
 - 21+ (18 if military)
 - Meet fed requirements to purchase
 - Handgun course
 - Not ineligible (felon, psychological diagnosis, etc.)

Licensed Carriers

- Ability to restrict by statute only
- Private business can restrict but govt. can't
 - Except employees (but not in car)
 - Except publicly posted meetings (but post sign)

Employee Restriction

- Prohibit in your facilities
- Does not include their cars
- Can't prohibit the public from carrying in your facility if licensed (how to deal with employee discomfort)
- Tex AG Opinion No. JC -0325 (2001) (govt employer can bar entry by verbal notice, sign, or other written notice)


Public Meeting Restriction

- Closed Meeting no restriction
- Open/Public Meeting ability to restrict with proper written notice
 - Place sign at room entrance; remove at conclusion
 - Restriction applies only to open meeting room(s)
- Jan 2019: Texas AG challenged City of Austin ban of guns at City Hall – court found ban violated open carry law; City fined \$9,000

Statutory Notice Requirements

Penal Code 30.06

- English and Spanish
- 1-inch high, contrasting color block letters
- Displayed conspicuously
- Clearly visible to public



Guns on Vehicles

- Virtually no restrictions...
- Public transportation authority cannot restrict except as permitted by law
 - Illegal type of gun (machine gun)
 - Carry without proper license (but how to determine this?)
 - Display gun in a manner calculated to alarm
