Best Practices Procurement Manual (BPPM)

- Recently updated (October 2016)
- Provides FTA grant recipients with information about third-party procurement requirements
- Designed to cover the entire procurement cycle: (1) Planning, (2) Selecting Type of Contracting Method, (3) Evaluation of Proposals and Contract Award, and (4) Contract Administration.

- The small purchase threshold references in the BPPM have now been updated to be consistent with the SuperCircular (2 CFR part 200)
- The small purchase threshold is now set at \$150,000 but will be periodically adjusted for inflation

- Protest Procedures:
- FTA's involvement in bid protests is somewhat limited with the publication of the SuperCircular.
- SuperCircular did not include the language found in 49 C.F.R. 18.36(b)(12) that provided for a direct appeal to FTA
- Violations of Federal Law or Reg
 - Discretionary: limited to issues impacting FTA's overall transportation program

- Protest Procedures:
- Notifying, and updating, the FTA when you receive a third party contract protest is a best practice but is no longer a requirement.



- FAST Act Sec 3019
 - Innovative Procurement & Leasing
 - Sets the parameters for joint cooperative purchasing of rolling stock and related equipment.
 - Addresses capital leases for rolling stock and related equipment, specifically for zero emission vehicles.

- FAST Act Sec 3019
 - Cooperative procurements
 - Highlights
 - Under the FAST Act, a grantee may now purchase rolling stock and related equipment from any State's cooperative procurement contract or schedule
 - "Procurement Not Limited to Intrastate Participants"
 - Pilot Program for Non-Profit Cooperative
 Procurements
 - Joint Procurement Clearinghouse

- FAST Act Sec 3019 cont...
 - Leasing
 - Highlights
 - The FAST Act encourages capital leasing arrangements in lieu of purchases, and encourages the capital leasing of zero emission vehicle components, particularly power sources (e.g. fluxcapacitor).
