What is the CCAM?

The Coordinating Council on Access and Mobility (CCAM) is an interagency partnership established by Executive Order to coordinate the efforts of the federal agencies that fund transportation services for targeted populations.



Mission

The CCAM issues policy recommendations and implements activities that improve the availability, accessibility, and efficiency of transportation for the following targeted populations:



People with Disabilities



Older Adults



Individuals of Low Income



Vision

Equal access to coordinated transportation for all Americans



What federal programs fund transportation?

Below is a sample of the 80 federal programs that may fund transportation services for people with disabilities, older adults, and individuals of low income.

Department of Health and Human Services

- Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)
- Medicaid
- Block Grant for Community Mental Health Services
- Centers for Independent Living (CILs)
- Older Americans Act (OAA) programs
- Health Center Program

Department of Labor

- Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) programs
- JobCorps

Department of Agriculture

- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)
- Community Facilities Loan and Grant Program

Department of Veterans Affairs

- Veterans Transportation Program (VTP)
- · Beneficiary Travel Service

Department of Transportation

- Formula Grants for Rural Areas
- Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities
- Urbanized Area Formula Program



If your organization receives funding from one of these programs, a portion of the funds may be used for transportation services.

You may also be able to collaborate across these federal programs to provide more transportation options for your community.

So What's So Great about Coordination?

- The right people and the right work makes mobility more:
 - Effective for diverse groups
 - Efficient for riders and providers
 - Accessible for all!





State & Regional Coordinated Councils Activities

- Share resources and advise each other
- Support state policies and legislation
- Host meetings and events
- Publish guidelines and resources for providers
- Establish regional forums/groups
- Make available ongoing communication forums
- Evaluate what and how they do develop performance measures with outputs and outcomes





Potential Coordination Outcomes

- Implement Policy Guidance and Supports for constituents
- Establish Cost Sharing for transportation services
- Develop vehicle sharing programs
- Conceptualize and launch cooperative programs across agencies
- Share staff across agencies
- Include a focus on mobility and transportation in priorities and grants
- Hold ongoing meetings and cooperative planning across agencies
- Develop performance measures related to the coordination that apply to partner agencies
- Create informational materials and agency resources
- Host joint events, conferences, webinars
- Invite personnel from partner agencies to serve on review panels or in advisory capacities





Connection between Coordination & Mobility Management

- Mobility Management:
 - means of implementing coordination
 - operationalizes coordination through tangible activities
 - is the "in practice" piece of coordination
 - enables regional and local assessment of coordination
