DOT Competitive Programs for Bus Systems



- Bus and Bus Facilities Infrastructure Investment
- Low and No Emission Vehicle Program
- BUILD (formerly TIGER)

Small Transit Intensive Cities (STIC) Program

- Created in the 2005 SAFETEA-LU Act
- Rewards high levels of service in small UZAs
- Awards based on 6 service factors:
 - Passenger Miles per Vehicle Revenue Mile
 - Passenger Miles per Vehicle Revenue Hour
 - Passenger Miles per Capita
 - Passenger Trips per Capita
 - Vehicle Revenue Mile per Capita
 - Vehicle Revenue Hour per Capita

STIC Program Allocations



- Must exceed average of larger UZAs
- FY18: 125 UZAs met at least one factor
- 42 states and Puerto Rico
- 10 UZAs met all 6 factors in FY18
- \$202,000 per factor in FY18

STIC Funding

- Must exceed average of larger UZAs
- FY18: 125 UZAs met at least one factor
- 42 states and Puerto Rico
- 10 UZAs met all 6 factors in FY18
- \$202,000 per factor in FY18
- 1.5% of Section 5307 program (\$68m)
