Washington, D.C. – "The American Public Transportation Association (APTA) and its 1,500 member organizations look forward to working with the Administration and Congress to invest in the nation's infrastructure, including public transportation. Americans are united in their support for infrastructure investment because they recognize the great need—a backlog of more than \$90 billion to bring the nation's public transportation systems up to a state of good repair.
