Mental Health Co-Responder Team

- Co-Responder Model
 - Officers partner with mental health clinicians and dispatch to respond to calls that have a mental health component
- Contracted through the Mental Health Center of Denver
 - 50% of salary and expenses are paid by RTD
 - 50% of salary and expenses are paid through Medicaid



Data Collection

Top 10 Primary Diagnoses

Bipolar Disorder	20%
Schizoaffective Disorder	18%
Major Depressive Disorder	14%
Schizophrenia Disorder	11%
Post-traumatic stress disorder, unspecified	8%
Depressive Disorder NOS	8%
Anxiety Disorder	4%
Mood Disorder	4%
Other Psychotic Disorder	4%
Post-traumatic stress disorder, chronic	3%

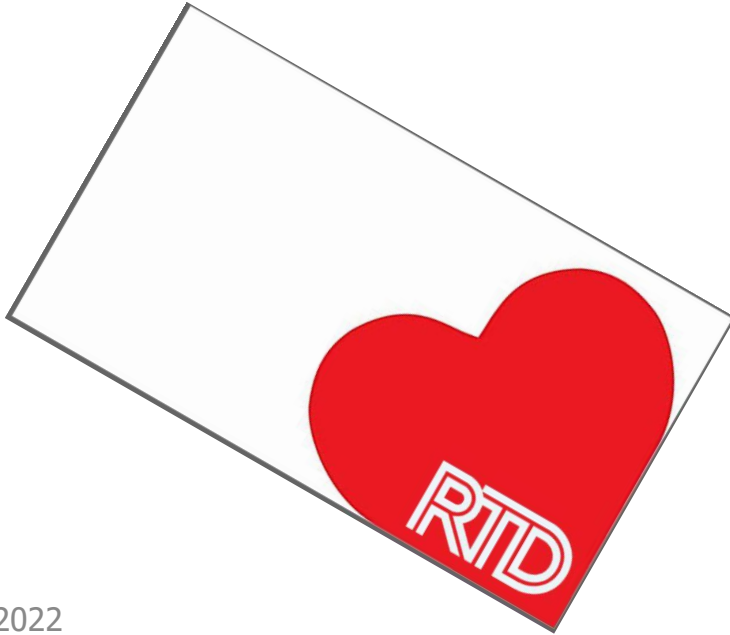
- Quarterly data from programs
- Over 60% of mental health contacts were individuals experiencing homelessness
- Utilized data to create mental health training videos for employees

Homeless Navigation Coordinator

- FTA Grant called HOPE (Helping Obtain Prosperity for Everyone)
 - Funding for Homeless Outreach Navigator
 - Contracted through Jefferson County Mental Health
 - ▶ Obtain information for outreach programs within the 8 counties and 42 cities RTD services
 - ▶ Assist with relocating individuals when displacing encampments along alignments and properties
 - Funding for bus route study
 - ▶ Determine routes effectiveness for ridership to existing outreach centers
 - ▶ Determine if routes need to be added for new outreach centers

Homelessness Awareness at RTD

- Regional Safety and Mental Health Resource pamphlets
 - Located on buses and trains
- RTD Heart Cards
 - Provided to Police and Security
